



As a pioneer in renewable energy, lowa passed one of the first Renewable Portfolio Standards (RPS) in the country in 1983. Iowa not only met its RPS goal but greatly surpassed it.

- lowa is number one in the nation in wind generation as a percentage of total power output at 27.4 percent. (AWEA, 2013)
- lowa ranks third in the nation in current wind generation output, with 5,177 MW installed. (AWEA, 2013)
- lowa and its robust supply chain support wind energy by manufacturing all major wind turbine components.

Numerous Iowa community colleges provide programs that facilitate the training needs of wind energy companies. Iowa Lakes Community College's program is the first of its kind in the nation and has received the American Wind Energy Association's Seal of Approval. (AWEA, 2011)
