Sioux City Welcomes Cold Link Logistics



The Southbridge Business Park in Sioux City will soon be the home to Cold Link Logistics, a Miami-based cold storage warehousing firm. The project was initially identified through an ongoing IADG prospecting initiative. As Cold Link Logistics learned more about Iowa, the Southbridge Business Park was identified as a top contender for its next warehouse location.

"We were approached about locating in Iowa and were immediately intrigued given its role as a major food producer in the U.S.," said Michael Mandich, president of Cold Link Logistics. "Sioux City became an ideal location due to many factors, but most importantly, we were welcomed by state and local leaders who truly valued the partnership and investment we were going to bring."

Construction began in March on the first phase of the project, a 185,000 sq. ft. cold storage warehouse facility. It is expected that through future phased expansion, the space will more than triple in size. Construction on the first phase is expected to be completed in early 2023, creating approximately 60 new jobs.

**Woodbury County REC** serves the Southbridge Business Park and is working closely with the City of Sioux City on significant infrastructure upgrades to the Southbridge Business Park and future Cold Link Logistics facility. Woodbury County REC and IADG were pleased to be among the partners in making this project happen.

# **Centro Adds Location** in Hampton

Centro, Inc. recently announced the purchase of the 30,000 sq. ft. shell building in the **Hampton** Air Industrial Park. The new facility will house two rotational molding machines



and employ 30 new associates. The expansion will allow Centro to expand its production capacity throughout the Midwest and accommodate the rapid growth of current demand and future business growth.

"This expansion represents continued confidence in our markets and our future business prospects. This, our 11th location, is an exciting opportunity in Hampton, Iowa,



which is a terrific Midwest community," said Brian Olesen, president, and CEO of Centro Inc.

The ever-growing footprint of Centro also includes the 2021 addition of a 30,000 sq. ft. facility in the Cascade Industrial Park. Maquoketa Valley Electric Cooperative and IADG were key partners with the Centro expansion in Cascade. When the company was considering another expansion, IADG was able to connect them with Franklin REC and the available speculative building in Hampton.

Centro, Inc., headquartered in North Liberty, is the largest custom rotational molder in North America. The company designs and manufactures custom rotational molded products for industries such as agriculture, construction, and lawn and garden. Franklin REC and Maquoketa Valley Electric Cooperative provide power to the Hampton and Cascade Centro locations respectively.

#### Perry Builds Another Spec Building



Perry Economic Development is under construction with its fourth shell building since its inception in 1984. The building has the same specifications as one built in 2018, now home to TCB Companies. It is a 30,000 sq. ft. all-steel, industrial, pole-style, insulated warehouse shell building with 30-foot sidewalls. The building is located on a 5.2-acre lot in the Perry Industrial Park, a designated Certified Site by the Iowa Economic Development Authority.

A unique partnership of **Guthrie County REC**, **Minburn** 

Communications, CIPCO, and IADG provided technical, planning, and financial support for the project. Guthrie County REC will provide electric power to this new building, and Minburn Communications will



accommodate the telecommunications and broadband needs. The building, currently under construction, is already garnering serious interest.

# Puck Enterprises Significant Expansion Underway



**Puck Enterprises**, located just south of Manning, is under construction on a massive 100,000 sq. ft. expansion. This expansion will significantly enhance Puck's production capabilities. Construction began in July of 2021. With the exterior near completion, the work is now focused on the interior to get the cranes and equipment installed, and production lines running.

This new building will serve several functions, including an automated powder coating line, allowing the company to have greater throughput. Puck plans to double the number of welding bays and triple the assembly space. The new building will also connect the current manufacturing line to the central warehouse. This will bring the product closer to the facility where all the finished products are stored.

"This new expansion is the next step towards being more efficient than ever before, allowing us to focus on building the most innovative equipment on the market," stated Jeremy Puck, Puck's president and CEO.

Puck has been expanding its campus in Manning since 2010. Today, in addition to the ever-growing headquarters, the company also has locations in Farley, IA; Worthing, SD; and Osijek, Croatia. The company currently employs 120 people and expect to add 30 additional positions to accommodate their growth. Puck also acquired BullDog Hose Company in Angier, NC, and U.S. Coupling in Dothan, AL to expand the product line in the Puck brand.



The initial planning stages are underway, which involve input from the development group, the county, Winnebago Cooperative Telecom Association (WCTA), Heartland Power, and other local leaders.
